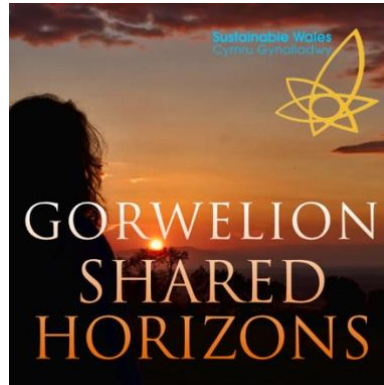

All writers were asked not to include polemics. What we have instead is sombre, surreal and highly original.

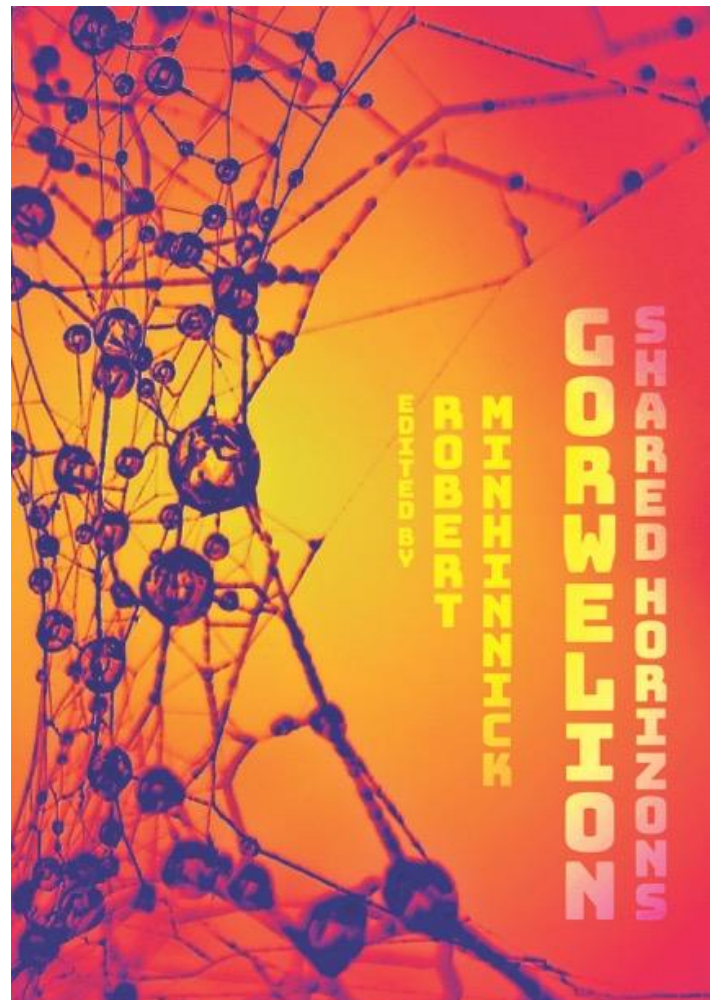
Included are five places in India, two in Scotland and seven in Wales, including the rarely celebrated Aberangell, Blaengarw and Newport's Ringlands.
